'Look at those windows!' Monkey cries. 'What a lot to do!'




It is time for work! Quickly, Monkey puts water in Pelly's beak. Then Monkey jumps on Giraffe's head.

'Bring the water to the fourth floor, Pelly,' Giraffe says.


'That's very high,' the Duke says.

'Duke,' Giraffe says. 'It's not high for me!'






Now Giraffe's head is at the fourth floor windows and Pelly flies up with the water. They smile and clean the windows.

We smile at the Duke.




'Giraffe, Pelly and Monkey, you can come and live here,' the Duke says.

'There's an old house,' I say. 'It was The Grubber – a sweet shop.'


'A SWEET SHOP!' the Duke shouts. 'You would like your own sweet shop. OK, let's buy it!'


